Greetings! I'm Pastor Rebecca Chaffee, the new Interim Pastor at Kenmore. Transitions can be challenging times, including feelings of grief, loss, and, sometimes, relief or anger. As we face a change in leadership, we notice other changes that have happened incrementally over the past decades. The neighborhood may look different. The membership has aged, as new people come and longtime members go. Our budgets look different, and the way we've always done things doesn't always fit our new reality. We land back at the existential questions we faced as adolescents, and again at each stage of our growth when we face questions of vocation and calling. Who am I? What is my purpose? Where am I headed? What's the best way to get there?

For all its challenges, transitional ministry is an exciting time. We look back at the many achievements of the past. We face squarely the realities of our current position. And we share visions of who we may become, as we seek first the kingdom of God. I look forward to our work together in God's service here at Kenmore Presbyterian Church.

As Interim Pastor, I'll provide the usual pastoral support: worship leadership and preaching, pastoral care, work with the session to provide for the life and ministry of the congregation, and staff and administrative support. In addition, "an Interim/Transitional Pastor leads a congregation during the transition time after an installed pastor has departed, helping the congregation prepare to welcome the leadership of a new installed pastor," according to our PC(USA) web site.

I'm looking forward to getting to know you all. As a part-time pastor, you can find me at the church on Sundays, Mondays, and by appointment on another day of the week. #### **ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING 2019**

God asks us "to share our bread with the hungry, shelter the homeless and to cover the naked" (Isaiah 58).

This year marks the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this special annual offering. Sponsored under the auspices of the Presbyterian Church USA, this offering plays a critical role in defining what it means to be a connectional church. It is such with an ecumenical intent, emphasizing our church's diversity to focus and take faith-based actions on the shared concerns on meeting the necessities of life for the hungry poor no matter who they are or where that poverty exists. This offering allows opportunities for partnership, learning profoundly reflecting on the life and mission of the church as a collective source to express God's love in manifesting that discipleship.

These responsibilities of our church are revealed through three great programs:



The Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program (PDA) receives 32% of funds created. This effort works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-made disasters, supporting refugees driven away by bringing in time sensitive clean food, water and temporary shelter until the restoration of the urban or rural infrastructure and a more normal way of life is resumed. PDA has established a 3 year 11 million

dollar budget to assist Texas, Florida, Puerto Rico and Haiti to support disaster assistance aid, distributing human assistance survival materials, loading in building reconstruction materials needed to recover from hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Marie over the past two years, trying to restore life activities in areas of complete destruction. Many mainland churches of all denominations have sent volunteers to assist in the rebuilding, whether skilled or not, they give of their time, talents and care; their living expenses met by the national church.



The Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP) using 36% of monetary income, takes action in short or long term emergency situations to alleviate hunger not only with direct aid, but using agricultural reform methods, especially in third world rural regions such as the Congo and Kenya in Africa, in tools, animals and pooled funds to increase crop output and provide employment in the jobs forthcoming. In Central Africa, increased planting of the moringa tree

forms many resources from this versatile tree, including nutritious food from its roots, building insulation from its elephant leaves and medicines from its bark.



<u>Self-Development of Peoples (SDOP)</u> receives 32% of the financial assistance brought in to relieve communities experiencing governmental oppression, creating poverty and injustice and to educate the world about how such issues infuse economic sustainability, not only in the countries of origin, but in surrounding nations. These cases affect our own nation as well, causing us to have to remediate legal abuse and the injustice resulting wherever found, via

advocacy, youth-led initiatives, skills development, on the job vocational training, promote the rights of unskilled farm workers, as well as improving their living conditions, being vaccinated and capacity-building of living space to get family member additions resettled and similarly protected under an equalizing legal system.

# **The Lord's Prayer**

This is a familiar prayer, however the words themselves may be a bit different from what you are used to. For the upcoming season of Lent, we have decided to use this version of the Lord's Prayer (you can find it on page 11 of the *Glory to God* hymnal) in our services. We'd like to use this as an opportunity to really think about the meaning of this prayer for us as individuals and as a congregation. Changing the version used can help us to carefully meditate on what we are praying rather than just recite words we are so used to saying each Sunday during worship.

We are hoping to also use our worship services, beginning on Ash Wednesday (March 6th at 7pm) to focus on the themes found in this prayer. KPC will be offering group study of the Lord's Prayer during Life After Church, which will present a great opportunity to meet our new interim pastor Rev. Rebecca Chaffee. - AND remembering them in your prayers.


